Women's Manifesto for the Republic

The Republic, joining all of us together in a great and prolonged wave of nationbuilding to engage all the people, will:

- <u>inspire us for the future of our country and complete unfinished business</u>; it will be a stepping stone towards a renewed, equal and inclusive nation.
- <u>assert the sovereign authority of the Commonwealth of Australia</u> by the will of all the people.
- <u>lessen our cynicism</u> by revitalising the involvement of everyone in public life and politics.
- <u>position us well</u> for the changed international environment by creating a post-colonial identity and allowing that to develop over time (revitalising the process of establishing our own *national identity* largely untouched since 1950).
- <u>defend and protect her people</u>, wherever they are, with accountability under the rule of law.
- express our profound love and respect for the land.
- <u>reaffirm our commitment</u> to freedom, equality, cooperation and a fair-go for all
- <u>be accompanied by a new Constitution</u> stating the equality of women and men before the law and recognising our Indigenous peoples.
- <u>provide for our own head of state alternating between women and men</u> as a true mark of equality and inclusion enshrined in the Constitution (so that it cannot be easily changed).

The new Commonwealth of Australia reconstituted as a Republic under the uniting symbol of the golden wattle, will create "the Great Republic of the Southern Seas" (1).
